

Not so fun fact: About half of Georgia's units have lost their tax-exempt status. Same nationally. You heard a lot of this last year in the #AmpUpLeadership programming and in 2024-2025 it is on the National stage to increase our awareness and our compliance.

Important IRS Tax Information

Do not forget! If your Unit's (or District's) fiscal year ended on June 30 (based on your IRS EIN Letter) your team should be getting ready to audit and submit your IRS 990 on time. It is due no later than November 15, 2024. If you do not know the date of your unit's tax period, you can go to https://apps.irs.gov/app/eos/ and enter the EIN number. Click on the items that come up and you will see the tax period.

It is especially important that each year the unit/district makes sure the correct person is listed with the IRS as the contact for the unit/district. This MUST be done either online when the unit files the 990 or by submitting IRS Form 8822-B containing the updated information.

We are finding that units/districts are not doing this. This inaction is resulting in the IRS contacting people who are no longer leaders, members, and in some cases no longer alive.

Another thing to do is check and make sure your Georgia Secretary of State registration is up to date. And do not forget to mail a copy of your IRS 990 to the Georgia Revenue Department.

I have it on good authority that our newly formed Risk & Compliance team is coming up to speed and will be a valuable resource to our department this administrative year.

Seriously - COMPLIANCE MATTERS!

Last, the 2024-2025 Newsletter will be published monthly on or about the 15th. As we move forward with a mindset on mission, we would like to have districts, committees, and yes, units share the great stuff that is happening around the department. The 5th of the month is the deadline for submitting articles.



MISSION POPPY PRIDE

As we begin a year of "Mission Excellence," we can take time to reflect on the mission bestowed upon us by our benefactor, Moina Michael. A farmer's daughter from Good Hope, Georgia in Walton County, she entrusted a legacy of serving Veterans in need of assistance using poppy donations. Thereby, we can make life easier for our service members and veterans.

POPPY FUND GUIDELINES from the National ALA. Poppy Funds may be used for:

- The rehabilitation of veterans honorably discharged from the United States Armed Forces after April 6, 1917.
- The welfare of the families of veterans from the date above.
- The rehabilitation of hospitalized military service personnel and the families of veterans and active duty personnel from the abovenamed period where financial need is evident.
- The purpose of poppy kits and supplies used to make symbolic poppies and poppy items that will be distributed for donations to the poppy fund.



HONOR FLIGHTS: Poppy funds may be used for direct support of the following reasons directly related to a Veteran's attendance on an Honor Flight.

<u>ForVeterans</u>: Food and Nutrition. Oxygen. Wheelchairs and Wheelchair accessible buses. And, Medical Teams on flights (one medic per bus- there are sometimes six medics per flight). Funds cover medic's food, identifying apparel, medical supplies, travel expenses, hotels.

<u>For the Guardian</u>: Airfare to accompany the veteran on the trip. Food and nutrition. Hotel accommodations to remain with veterans during the trip. Training associated need to execute necessary tasks- food, room rental, medical training, identifying articles of clothing. Transportation to the airport with Veteran, if required. Hotel the night before the flight, if required.

Unit Poppy Funds can only be used for the Veteran and Guardian, not for administrative purposes.

NATIONAL VETERANS CREATIVE ARTS FUND: Poppy funds <u>may</u> be used for the NVCAF. Donations should be submitted through the National ALA organization and earmarked NVCAF or donate online.

ASYMCA: Poppy funds may be used for food needs of the Veteran. If there is an Armed Forces YMCA near your Unit, this is a place to donate Poppy Funds for food needs. Donations may be submitted through National Donations at ASYMCA.org.

Members, MAKE IT YOUR MISSION, to share "Poppy Pride" in our communities and schools.
