NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEEWOMAN (2022-2026)

It is my pleasure to serve the Department for a third year as the elected member to the National Executive Committee (NEC).

Someone asked me recently "what does that mean, NEC"?

Like the District Presidents in our

Department serve on our Georgia Department Executive Committee (DEC) along with our elected and staff officers and our Department Past Presidents, I serve on the National Executive Committee alongside the NEC members from all other states, the national elected officers, and Past National Presidents.

If you review my article in the September newsletter, you will find my update to the Department of what transpired at the most recent NEC meetings. As a member of the NEC, I must come to meetings prepared, with a thorough understanding of what is being discussed and voted on to represent the organization to the best of my ability.

The training that we NEC members must go through is comprehensive and very similar to the material found in the document "DEC 101". The guidance in this document can also, as with a lot of the National and Department level materials, be applied at the District and Unit levels. In my years on the GA DEC, I have learned that many of our units and districts, and sometimes even those new to the DEC, do not fully understand their role on the executive committee. At all levels, the "EC" serves as the "board of directors" for the entity just like the NEC does for National. For our DEC, much of this material was covered in the day-long organizational meeting on August 10.

NEC members are reminded on a regular basis that we are "entrusted with adopting sound corporate policy, ensuring fiduciary standards and fiscal health of the organization, and bear responsibility for strategic direction." We are also reminded that the NEC is responsible for overall governance. Our annual training guides us to the functions of other key committees at the National level, which also apply to Departments. The function of the Risk & Compliance Committee is risk management and oversight; the function of the Finance Committee is financial review, reporting and annual budget preparation, and the function of the Headquarters staff is day-to-day management.

Another responsibility of the executive committee is the responsibility for fiduciary integrity and fiscal soundness. It is practiced in the NEC and in many DECs across the country and other non-profits that each member of the governing board donates to the organization for which they serve.

As a corporate director at any level, unit, district, department or in my case, national, our primary role as a member of the organization's governing body is to protect the organization. This includes being fully aware of all our governing documents, being prepared, and removing any personal bias or other influences from our decision-making so that as individuals and thus, the executive committee, we put the health and wellbeing of the organization first in the decision making process.

I am excited for those that will get to attend the Fall Conference. Many of you may know that our Alternate NEC, Past Department President Pat Morgan will be standing in for me as I am unable to attend because of an injury and I am going through recovery and rehabilitation. This will be the first department conference I have missed since 2015. As a courtesy, President Waybright briefed me on the agenda so I know that there will be fantastic learning, networking and fun taking place. I am sorry I will miss seeing you and taking part in the event.

In closing, if you are a member of a unit, district, department or like me, national executive committee, our primary responsibility is "to serve as a forward-thinking fiduciary steward of the organization to ensure its financial sufficiency and organizational integrity through strategy and policy that afford future generations the opportunity to participate in our mission."

LEGION FAMILY NEWS

New partnership for The American Legion: The American Legion has entered an official partnership with the Army-Navy Football Game presented by USAA. The Army-Navy Game is among the longest standing and most storied rivalries in college football history. This year, the game will be played on Dec. 14. This new partnership aligns with the Legion's core values of service, patriotism, and camaraderie. The American Legion is the first veterans service organization to sponsor this annual game. The American Legion will also be participating in year-round sponsorships of both Army West Point Athletics and Navy Athletics. These agreements help raise awareness of the Be the One mission to reduce the number of veterans and servicemembers lost to suicide.

The Samsung American Legion Scholarship is awarded to 10 national scholars, 10 runners-up and 75 finalists. The Samsung American Legion Scholarship is awarding \$243,750 in scholarships to 95 recipients who attended either the 2024 American Legion Boys State or Auxiliary Girls State session. The recipients were selected by The American Legion's Committee on Youth Education during the organization's annual Fall Meetings in Indianapolis the week of Oct. 7. Read more HERE.

Have you ever been to the Department of Georgia Headquarters in Stockbridge?

I paid a visit to headquarters recently and found a piece of history to share with you.

In the archives I found a 5th District Yearbook from 1986 and coincidentally, I'm from District 5.

The first thing I noticed was the unit membership totals. At the end of the year in 1986, the total membership was 1,248. At the end of 2023 – 2024 our membership total was 1,292, a difference of only 44 members. Unit 29 in Marietta has grown from 191 to 411 and Unit 70 in Villa Rica has grown from 18 to 136. Out of 15 units, four no longer exist, five have less members, three are new and the rest have stayed close to the same. The number of units changed from fourteen to fifteen.

In 1986 Unit 111 in Dallas lost their Post to a lightning strike that destroyed the Post. At the time they had 44 members. Then, the 5th District included Post 111 as one of its missions.

Thirty-eight years later they are still going strong with 87 members. On Sunday September 29, they hosted their 10th annual Gold Star Mother's and Family Day. This year's event was amazing and next year it will be even better.

Years from now another historian may walk into that room looking for a piece of history as I did. That piece of history could be about this year's hurricane. Will your Unit be one that just survives, one that thrives or one that fades away? If you don't tell your story, no one will ever know.

Please send me information about your events or even photos so it can be preserved and shared with future Unit members.

Remember that I'm always available to answer questions or emails.

Please promote this camp to all your members and, recruit a few new members while you are at it.






MISSION POPPY GROWTH

Suggested ideas to increase and grow awareness in our communities include:

- Promote the poppy in schools and with local youth groups such as scouts, homeschoolers, etc.by providing coloring sheets downloaded from the National ALA Poppy Committee website. Make arrangements with school administrators and/or leaders for story time to read "The Poppy Lady: Moina Belle Michael and her Tribute to Veterans." Provide poppy craft ideas for youth. And most importantly, implement a program of Poppy Poster Submissions from the students and youth in the community (including grandchildren).
- Plan Poppy Distribution Events at festivals and community events by reserving a booth in advance with sponsors or schedule storefront distribution with managers of local businesses (Veteran owned businesses are normally very agreeable).
- Contact your local government offices to arrange a day and time to attend one of their regularly scheduled meetings and schedule a "Poppy Proclamation Presentation." The local officials will present the document to Auxiliary members. A sample proclamation to share with them is available on National's website. Pin those officials with a poppy corsage prior to the meeting. Working with your government leaders is beneficial to all. Invite them to Post events as well.
- To get Juniors excited about the Poppy, invite them to finger-paint poppy cards or other poppy crafts. These can then be shared with Veterans in VA Hospitals or local nursing homes. Juniors reading the "Poppy Lady" in these facilities give veterans joy and a sense of pride. Prepare "Poppy in the Window" displays using card stock to decorate the veteran's door or hang it in their room (removable adhesives work best).
- Show your Poppy Pride by wearing a Poppy Pin when in public places. It is awesome to have someone inquire about what it signifies and ask how they can obtain one.
- Use poppies to decorate for Post events inside and outside.
- Look at the National poppy committee online blogs for ideas applied by other Departments.
- Celebrate Poppies Everyday as demonstrated by Moina Michael.

"GROW GEORGIA RED IN SUPPORT OF VETERANS"

Members attending Fall Conference later this month will receive a packet of poppy seeds to plant this

fall. In Georgia, poppies are considered a cool-season crop and perform better with a period of cool temperatures.


