As part of The American Legion Be the One mission to end veteran suicide, the Legion has joined forces with Columbia University to develop training for those who want to learn more about interacting and responding with veterans who may be in crisis. After the training, participants will be able to:

- Use the Columbia Suicide Severity Rating Scale to determine at-risk individuals.
- Identify risk factors and warning signs
- Outline the types of suicidal ideation and four behaviors that indicate imminent risk.
- Communicate effectively with an individual who may be at risk of hurting themselves.
- Members of The American Legion Family are encouraged to take part in this training and share the training with their communities. Check back to this page or subscribe to The American Legion Online Update newsletter to receive information about new training opportunities as they become available.



NOT SO FUN FACT: About half of Georgia's units and districts have lost IRS tax-exempt status. In 2024-2025 the National ALA asks that we to increase our level of compliance.

All Unit and District officers are encouraged to seek information and *ask questions*:

- Does the Unit/District comply with the IRS?
- Is the person designated as the IRS RESPONSIBLE PARTY for the Unit/District alive? ... active in the unit? ... able to continue to represent the unit?
- Does the Unit/District have an annual checklist and transition plan for compliance and all things financial?

COMPLIANCE CORNER

Kathy Merritt, Chair of Risk & Compliance

If you attended the Department Fall Conference, you heard a lot about Compliance.

But what is compliance? And why should you care? <u>Compliance is how we stay right with the law, right with National policies and right with Department policies.</u>

But again, who cares? You should because if you don't, *YOU* could be personally liable. *What?* Yes, you read that correctly, if you aren't right with the law, right with the IRS, then you personally, out of your own personal bank account could be held responsible to pay any fines.

Well, that was scary! How do I keep that from happening? Well, that's easyget in compliance. Ok, so that might not be that easy, but your Risk and Compliance team is here to help ...really.

We know it's easy to say, "get into compliance," but if you are a new President at any level, you don't know where to start because no one probably told you. If you have been a President, you may be in a rut and not realize that you're not in compliance and may not really know where to start either. So, to get you on the path to compliance, your R&C team developed a tool that can help. Is it perfect? No way! But it's a start and it's better than nothing. See pages 19-20.

We created a checklist that is divided into 3 parts, mandatory items, highly encouraged and things to make you shine. Take that checklist and start on the mandatory items. These are the items that are required by law, the IRS, National or the Department. Focus on these items for the next 3 months and you'll be well on your way to compliance.

In this checklist, you are also provided with reference material or links of where to go to accomplish the task. There is a lot of information out there and it can be overwhelming, but the checklist can help focus your efforts.

R&C also developed a Unit Engagement Form for District Presidents to help their units. When the District President visits your unit, this Engagement Form can help focus their visit on items that are mandatory. The District Presidents have access to material that can help your unit, so ask them. They attended the Organizational Meeting on August 10 and a lot of the information they received is useful for coming into compliance.

This is a team effort to bring the Department of Georgia into compliance; so, if you need help ask. We really are here to help and together we can get this done.

ABOUT MEMBERSHIP ELIGIBILITY

As our department officers have been travelling around the state and interacting with units and districts, an interesting topic for discussion has popped up in a few places. **ELIGIBILITY!** YES, there may be an *OOOPS!* situation here and there in our rosters. MOVING FORWARD as we recruit new members; it is imperative that our units and the Post officers that are signing off on membership eligibility are following the eligibility rules exactly as established by The American Legion per IRS guidelines. *Remember units are responsible for having only eligible members. Any unit member within the same unit can challenge the membership eligibility of a current member or a person being considered for membership.*

Let's be clear on these points:

- <u>The Greats</u>: No great granddaughters or great grandmothers are eligible. *Only two levels of consanguinity are permitted: daughter, granddaughter, mother, and grandmother. (It is an IRS regulation we must follow.)*
- The Steps: Eligibility does **not** flow through step parents or step children. (It is an IRS regulation we must follow.)
- The Adopted: **Yes!** Direct AND (*legally*) adopted descendants **are** eligible.
- The In-Laws: **No!** Father in-laws or son in-laws cannot be used for eligibility. Remember, DIRECT descendants.
- <u>SAL spouse, father, father-in-law</u>: The wives and daughters or granddaughters of S.A.L. members **who are NOT** veterans and who are not members of The American Legion if living are **not** eligible.
- <u>ALA Spouses</u>: A member of the ALA must meet eligibility as established in the rules. The ONLY males that are eligible for membership in the ALA are the spouses of veterans (female or male) who if alive, are members of The American Legion. <u>We must stop that rumor that husbands of ALA members who are not veterans are eligible!</u>
- <u>Female relatives of Female Veterans</u>: **Yes!** All sisters, mothers, daughters, granddaughters, and grandmothers, and legally adopted are eligible. If the female veteran if alive, she MUST be a member of The American Legion.

Good Deed Award winners receive a certificate and a letter from the National President. **Youth should demonstrate** leadership through community service.

On October 6, 2024 during the annual Fall Meetings of The American Legion, a motion was made and voted on by the American Legion CWF board of directors to change the name of the foundation to one that encompasses the overall needs of the whole child and all aspects of their physical, emotional, mental and spiritual wellbeing.

CWF will continue to provide grants to nonprofits for projects that contribute to the physical, mental, emotional and spiritual needs of children. Grants are only given to

entities that help U.S. children in a large geographic area; they are not awarded for day-to-day or special operating expenses. Thanks to the generosity of Legion Family and community members, the foundation has awarded over \$21 million in grants since 1954 — giving youth-serving nonprofits across this nation the means to promote and operate their programs, plus educate families and communities about the needs of children.

- The YELLOW center stands for hope, like a ray of sunshine for a better future.


