What a whirlwind membership year this has been! As I am writing this, I can tell you we have over fifty units that made 100% of their membership goal this year. One of our newer units is sitting at 276.92% of its goal, and that is some challenging work being done.

I was also inspired by all our membership and what they did at their units to make their goal. Alas, this is not allowed so I will be running for the Department's 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President in June, and I hope to take on the challenge of offering the best Leadership

classes this Department has ever offered. All I will say is, I have already started working on this as learning is a lifelong process. It is time for Convention!

All Department Leaders and Unit Presidents should have received the Call to Convention. Please let me know if you did not receive an email.

If you have not submitted your mandatory forms yet, remember we are all in this together managing the administration of units. Every unit must submit the following by the date listed.

- Unit Dues Rate Change Form 2026 (Due May 1 2025)
- Unit Officers Yearly Form 2025/ 2026 (Due June 3)
- Unit Data Form 2026 (Due June 3)
- Unit Delegates to Department Convention (Due June 7)

Another thing to remember is that if your Unit's (or District's) fiscal year ends June 30 (based on your IRS EIN Letter) your team should be getting ready to audit and submit your IRS 990 on time. Another thing to do is check and make sure you Georgia Secretary of State registration is up to date.

The 24-25 UNIT OBLIGATIONS were due April 1 – only delegates from units that are in compliance are eligible to vote at Convention – please check into this and make sure the paperwork and obligations were submitted.

The biggest opportunities all our units have in June and July is conducting a successful transition. National confirms that units' leaders that share knowledge and pass on all paperwork and materials that belong to the unit and support the new leaders are highly successful and its easier for units to not miss a beat in serving our veterans, military, and our communities.

The Department has done a deep dive into updating its constitution, bylaws, and standing rules. At the Department National Leadership Conference, the National Parliamentarian shared very specific directions for making governing documents clearer, accurate and up to date. There are three resolutions that all convention delegates should review. Units and Districts may want to check out their documents too! (Hint hint)

As we move forward with a mindset on mission, we would like to have districts, committees, and yes, units share the great stuff that is happening around the department.

Have you sent in your registration forms, remember you must be registered.

It's hard to believe that it has been a year since someone mentioned that the Historian job was open and asked if I was interested. I accepted because it was going to give me better insight to the way the Auxiliary has been governed through the years. Reading past histories showed me that the questions I've been asking were the same questions that were asked decades ago. The only differences are the variation of answers. It all comes back to reading your Constitution and Bylaws.

Following National President Trish Ward's visit to both the birthplace and resting place of Moina Michael and National Poppy Day, I put in some investigative time. Moina Michael is not just a name associated with the poppy. "The Poppy Lady " is scattered throughout the histories of both the Legion and the Auxiliary of Georgia. She spoke at many Department of Georgia Conventions, participated with the poppy anchors and received many awards. Miss Michael delivered her idea for the poppy to Charles D. Montgomery Post No. 1 Atlanta on August 18, 1920. At the Department of Georgia Convention a resolution was read and passed to adopt the poppy as official flower of the Legion. The Georgia Delegation took the resolution to the National Convention in Cleveland where it was unanimously adopted. In October 1921 at National Convention the American Legion Auxiliary also adopted the poppy as its official flower.

On page 8 of the 1939 Department History Book I found this letter

#### **GREETINGS FROM OUR "POPPY LADY"**

To The American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Georgia: The ancient Romans, in their grandeur days of aspiration and achievements, searched among their patrician maidens for the fairest, the purest and the truest to keep the sacred fires on their holy altars eternally brightly burning.

To me, the women of my "Buddies" of the World Was Service are providentially chosen members of the American Legion Auxiliary for the same sacred and beautiful task through the privilege of "Keeping the home fires burning."

To me, you are fairer, purer, truer than the choicest maidens of ancient Rome who so beautifully contributed to the "Grandeur that was Rome."

It has been a "long, long trail a-winding into the land of my dreams....when they would be going down that long, long trail with you". So, it is yours to "Keep the home fires burning"....while God keeps watch over you and America.

It has been an interesting journey this year. I wish the incoming Department Officers a very successful year. I will still be around, just exchanging a seat on the stage for one on the floor.
