DON'T BE LEFT OUT OF THE DEPARTMENT 2021-2022 HISTORY BOOK! This is your chance to share your

Unit and/or District's magnificent work and lessons learned since we closed our convention last June.

All Units and District Presidents should have already submitted information to me for inclusion in the 2021-2022 Department of Georgia History Book. We cannot wait until May or June to get this done...assembling the Department History Book is underway RIGHT NOW and will wrap up the day after Convention in June. **No Unit or District submittals will be accepted after June 12th.**

IT IS REALLY SIMPLE...Send two things – 1) a photo or two of an event/activity and 2) written specifics such as Unit number, city/town, activity, benefitting group, names of those leading the effort, names of those pictured, and how much money was raised (if a fundraiser), what the funds are for, how many meals served, children served, hours volunteered, etc. This can simply be a copy of what you are inserting in your history book/report. ***There is no form or strict guideline on how to submit – jut get information written up and to me ASAP.***

By now your history books should be ALMOST complete for the year! “When details are fresh in our minds, it is much easier to present a clear picture of the event.”
