





"The American Legion Auxiliary brand mark (pictured right) was created to address the need to modernize the ALA brand to appeal to the next generation. The new brand mark takes into consideration a host of applications that the original emblem could never have anticipated. Those include digital and social media, special event and sports marketing, lifestyle apparel and more."

Going forward, the brand mark is to be used in all marketing communications applications. "When choosing a brand mark option, default to what is most visually pleasing in that application. or example, the word mark (right) should almost always be used in embroidery."

The Reason we Report, Tips & Tricks

"Every hour and dollar ALA members invest in our mission of helping veterans adds up." Service not only "gives each member a sense of pride in belonging to the organization, but it allows the ALA to demonstrate our mission service and effectiveness to our donors and to the world." This service and money spent by individuals is reported on IMPACT REPORTS to each unit. The units then report to the districts and departments.

Departments combine the numbers and report to National Headquarters which then compiles and reports to The American Legion which includes the data in its annual report to Congress.

Members should report EVERY MONTH preferably using the ALA impact report form – it's simple to use and has recently been streamlined. Since we no longer "do" mid-year reports, waiting until the end of the year makes the process a burden and cumbersome – and people forget things, remarkable things, they did so many efforts go unreported.

Let's make our reporting for 2022-2023 a priority.



Members and units that report

typically have stronger relationships within units and with that, solid service within the four pillars of our mission – VA&R, National Security, Americanism, and Children & Youth.

A common question is "Can I count hours spent preparing meals for Legion meetings and administrative support for TAL commanders as hours spent in Service to Veterans?" The Answer is "Yes! Those hours count but should be reported under "Section 4: My Service Representing the ALA in My Community."

Some of our members aptly describe those activities as family chores." Remember too, individuals serving in volunteer roles at all levels should record hours and money spent on their individual impact reports in this same area – yes, "family chores" matter.

Bulletin #1 November 2022

Georgia Girls State will be held in Valdosta, Georgia at Valdosta State University June 11-16, 2023

QUALIFICATIONS: Interest in government, leadership, citizenship, honesty, scholarship, character, and completion of their junior year in high school.

ORIENTATION: Orientation should be a part of your Girls State plan so that the girls and their parents understand in advance what to expect upon arrival. Please call on a staff member or former citizen in your area to help with your orientation if help is needed.

PUBILICITY: Unit chairmen, be sure to contact local media for coverage as soon as your delegates have been selected. Many newspapers are willing to publish pictures and short articles about the program. Invite delegates to a unit meeting after the session to report to the unit.

FEE: Checks must be made out to Girls State and mailed to the Department Headquarters. Send the fee of \$350.00 per girl to the American Legion Auxiliary Department Headquarters, 3035 Mt. Zion Road, Stockbridge, GA 30281 before April 20, 2023 to assure space for your girls. Call the director for late payments of fees. Please do not hold the fees to make sure the girl plans to attend. Please DO NOT hold your unit check to make sure your girls are attending. This really hurts our program. Any money that is sent in helps Georgia Girls State even if your girls doesn't attend. If your girl backs out at the last minute, there are other worthy girls that the money can cover. It can also be a donation to the program to help cover other costs. We have expenses to pay before the session begins, so please do not hold the fees. Parents nor family members should not pay the fee for their daughter. **DISTRICTS: Each district is to elect a counselor and pay \$350.00 counselor fee. Please notify the director upon

the election and have the counselor send the director a resume. Even if your district doesn't elect a counselor, the fee is still to be paid. I need counselors: Please contact me if interested!!
