## UNIT REVITALIZATION

### HOW TO CULTIVATE ACTIVE MEMBERS, Part 2

Meetings, Newsletters and Personal Contact

It's important to have a permanent place so members will know where the meetings will be held. Ensure that all members know the time, place and date of each meeting. Control the length of your meetings by using an agenda. Copies of the agenda can be printed for each member or it can be written on a large flip poster or poster paper to be displayed.

As a side note, to prevent bickering at a meeting, the President can point to the agenda and mention that "bickering" is not on the agenda!

Newsletters can contain a list of future activities or a report of what has been done recently. Always give the members information about unit activities as a member might see an event in which they'd like to participate. Always include a reminder about the meeting time, place and date. The goal is to motivate the reader to wish she had been at the meeting. If a Unit does not have the resources to produce a newsletter, email messages can be sent to the members to keep them informed.

It is recommended that each Unit have a member visitation program to reach members through personal contact. Former members have said that the main reason that they did not renew was because no one contacted them after they were mailed their membership card. Unit leaders have to make members feel appreciated. Units can establish a Calling Committee - members who keep in touch with other members who do no attend meetings - and a Welcoming Committee - members who keep in touch with new members to explain more about Auxiliary programs, to invite participation and to show that the Auxiliary is a caring organization.

## April is the Month of the Military Child

Each year, April is set aside as a military child appreciation month, officially known as Month of the Military Child, recognizing the important role military children play in the military community, the sacrifices they are making and the challenges they have to overcome.

Started in the mid-1980s by Caspar Weinberger, the Pentagon and other military support organizations and agencies designate the month of April to recognize military kids for their sacrifice and bravery on the Homefront.. The term "military brat" is a title proudly worn by many generations of children who traveled the world with their parents, ensuring them that they have the strength to handle anything. Military children must cope with separations, deployments, frequent moves and even their parents' injuries as part of the life they were born into. Although they did choose this lifestyle these brave sons and daughters are committed to support their military parents.

The American Legion Family joins the Department of Defense in celebrating these young warriors.

#### The Military Child's Table Ceremony

The Military Child's Table Setting was inspired by the POW/MIA ceremony to honor the sacrifices and contributions of our military children.

The Potted Flowering Plant symbolizes that they may flower and flourish where planted.

The Hand Spade recognizes that they may be transplanted to a new location any place in the world at a moment's notice, where they become fully immersed in the culture, make new friends and acclimate themselves to a new school.

The Birthday Hat and Unlit Candles...Baseball Glove and Ball...and Ballet Slippers represent the fact that, sometimes special occasions are missed by one or both parents while serving their country.

The Family Photo depicting a child or children with their uniformed parent represents the foundation of our country's strength.

Families united in their commitment to national service and willing to make any sacrifice, both at home and abroad...to ensure that our flag continues to fly free.

In the month of April we set aside time to recognize military families and their children for the sacrifices they make, the resilience they display and the challenges they overcome. While they are able to see the world, meet new people, and have all kinds of interesting experiences, it can be challenging to be uprooted every 2-3 year, leaving friends behind and starting over at a new school. According to the Department of Defense Education Activity the average child in a military family moves six to nine times during a school career which represents three times more frequently than the average non-military family.

What can we as the American Legion Auxiliary do to promote Military Kids Month?



Although activities are limited due to the current COVID19 pandemic, there are still lots of things to do to honor our military children:

Participate in "Purple Up! For Military Kids"– DoD communities wear purple to show support and thank military children for their strength and sacrifices. Purple symbolizes the combined colors of all branches of the military-Army green, Coast Guard blue, Air Force blue, Marine red, and Navy blue. Although you may not be able to go out in the community you can always show your support on social media (wearing purple, hold up a banner or homemade sign etc.) Feature the Month of the Military on your Website and Social Media - Many American Legion families have a


website and a Social Media page where the Month of the Military Child can be promoted.

Publicize in Community Events—Publicize the meaning of the Month of the Military Child through local radio and TV

stations since we currently are not able to participate in any events.

**Military readiness programs** – through these programs we can serve as a support system for children and their families. **Military Child Appreciation Day** – You might not be able to have a designated day in the near future to invite families and community leaders to the post to discuss the challenges military children are facing, but we shouldn't only remember these children one month out of the year. Sponsor an event at the Post home at a later date and invite subject-matter experts on child safety, health and education; having a firetruck or law enforcement vehicles at these events are always a highlight.

If you have military families in your neighborhood, send them a card to let them know they are appreciated and thought of.
