Welcome to April

Now is the time of year that Units start preparing to fill out and submit forms and reports. It matters!

<u>The first form & payment due is the Department</u> <u>Obligations/Contributions Form (and payment) was *due by* <u>April 1, 2023</u>. Go to <u>https://www.aladeptga.com/forms-1</u></u>

The second form to stay focused on is the Dues Rate Change 2024 Form *due no later than May 1, 2023.* Both National and the Department of Georgia voted in favor of dues increases that take effect July 1, 2023, when we begin our 2024 membership campaign. (Sample on page 9)

It is critical to note that many unit bylaws or standing rules **require the unit general membership vote on changes (increases) to unit membership dues.** Please plan accordingly, make sure your membership meets and votes so the unit can submit the form on time.

Unit Dues MUST be equal to or higher than \$34.

National is \$18 and Department is \$16. As such, many units have selected \$40, \$45, or \$50 so the units can keep \$6, \$11, or \$16 for membership use, respectively.

Note – Junior National and Department dues each remain at \$2.50 (\$5 total). Evaluate and make changes as determined by the unit general membership.

<u>The third form</u> is registration for attending the June Convention in June. See the Department website.

Annual reports are due soon. All reports need to be prepared and submitted on the CURRENT FORMS at our website. Please check with your District leadership – they may require submittal to the District prior to the general May 1 due date to Department Chairs and Officers. Remember, Units submit to both Department and District. Books are handled differently.

The **Poppy Anchor Launch is on Memorial Day, May 29**. If you plan to attend, you must be on the list – there is limited space. Please let Pat



Morgan know if you wish to attend. District 2 extends thanks to all those that donated funds or poppies to help in the construction of the anchor. Any that were left over or received late will be sent to District 1 for the 2024 Poppy Anchor.


Our Mission Matters – amping up our membership <u>can</u> build unit foundational strength!

The youth in Georgia deserve to be taught to appreciate the significance of this beautiful symbol.



One Unit in the Department of Georgia is currently working with their high school and middle schools Agriculture Programs by providing poppy seeds to the Future Farmers of America. One agriculture instructor drove to the former Michael family property in Good Hope to learn more about the "Poppy Lady". On his return to the school, he shared the information with Social Studies teachers. High School students have remarked about driving the "Moina Michael Highway". A small project has managed to make an impact on these students.

If you are currently working on your poppy program, the rules have been recently updated to reflect those of our National American Legion Auxiliary Poppy Program. Please refer to our Department of Georgia website.

New this year, the National Poppy Committee has added incentives in the form of monetary awards for poppy poster winners. Each ALA Division winner will receive a \$50. check in the mail. A \$50. donation will also be made to the Children of Warrior Fund in the winner's name. The disbursements will be sent out to the winners during the summer months. Therefore, our Units will need to include good contact information on the back of the entries.

Georgia Girls State Bulletin

Georgia Girls State will be held in Valdosta, Georgia at Valdosta State University June 11 – 16, 2023

We will be in Georgia Hall again this year. No visitors allowed except for the Inauguration and Graduation

QUALIFICATIONS: Interest in government, leadership, citizenship, honesty, scholarship, character, and completion of their junior year in high school. We are an organization whose belief is For God and Country. We are absolutely not obligated to sponsor girls who disagree with pledging the flag. Just because the school recommends a girl does not make her entitled to attend unless the Unit approves using our criteria. Please make sure your unit approves the girls.

ORIENTATION: Orientation should be a part of your Girls State plan so that the girls and their parents understand in advance what to expect upon arrival. Please call on a staff member in your area to help with your orientation if help is needed. Former Girls State Citizens can also be helpful when getting students prepared for the session.

FEE: Checks must be made out to Georgia Girls State and mailed to the Department Headquarters. Send the fee of \$350.00 per girl to the American Legion Auxiliary Department Headquarters, 3035 Mt. Zion Road, Stockbridge, GA 30281 before April 20, 2023, to assure space for your girls. Call the director for late payments of fees. Please do not hold the fees to make sure the girl plans to attend. Send the fees early so that we will have an estimate of how many girls to **expect.** There are many plans and decisions that must be made so having the fees in on time is imperative. If your girl backs out at the last minute, there are other worthy girls that the money can cover. It can also be a donation to the program to help cover other costs. We have expenses to pay before the session begins, so please do not hold the fees. Parents nor family members should not pay the fee for the girl.

APPLICATIONS: The 2023 online application is available on the website. This is a new and hopefully better and easier application. It opens on March 1, 2023. UNITS will receive an email prior to March 1 with an explanation of the new online application process. If you do/did not receive the explanation email, please text me at 770-337-7997 or email me at georgiagirlsstate@gmail.com to let me know and I'll send you the information. After the online application is complete, the girl and the parent will receive an email with a link to the forms packet. There is no waiver or key agreement from Valdosta State University. The keys are key cards similar to hotel keys. Lost key cards will cost the girl \$15.00.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS: Delays cause your girls to have difficulty in getting prepared for the program. If you find out that a girl is not coming after having sent in her application, please let us know. We make phone calls to all no shows and it will help us if we can limit the number of calls necessary. Let us know even up the last day.

IMPACT REPORTS

It is time to get the reporting done. It starts with YOU - the MEMBERS!

Here – in the impact report - is what

did in the past 12 months since May 1* last year.

Members submit their impact reports to the Unit President or her/his designee. This is for service from May 1st of last year *OR* the last time they reported. Check with your Unit President for the deadline.

Unit Presidents then compile this data and submit the UNIT IMPACT REPORT to their District Presidents. <u>Check with your District President for the</u> <u>deadline!</u>

District Presidents submit their DISTRICT IMPACT REPORTS to the Department President no later than MAY 10 so that the Department can submit its complete IMPACT REPORT **ON TIME** to National (6/1).

In 2022, 10 of 12 districts submitted. Let's get to 100% this year – help your District President get this done so that EVERY HOUR, DOLLAR, and MILE is reported.

Heads up: American Legion National Headquarters IT staff has become aware of an unauthorized "My Legion App" currently available from the Android and Apple stores. The app was created by organizations identified as "Giant Killer" (Apple App Store) and "Feel Good 7" (Google Play).

Please do not engage with these sellers or download the app, as they do not have permission to use our name and likeness, and they are charging a monthly fee. The American Legion's intellectual property attorney is exploring legal options. American Legion National Headquarters has no plans produce a fee-for-service app. We are actively working on a mobile application focused on helping local posts and individual members. When our official app is ready, it will be announced through official Legion channels and will be identified with The American Legion as the "seller" once published to the app stores.

NOTE about mileage and time. Travel time counts: if you are going to an event/activity, record the travel time and the mileage (in dollars). It is YOUR TIME – <u>your time has value</u> – traveling to/from and DOING is YOUR TIME. However, do not double dip on the mileage – example, do not record money you spent on gas, only record the equivalent amount of dollars for the miles you drove. Example, if you drove 10 miles, you report \$1.40 and the amount of time to drive to/from

IRS issues standard mileage rates for 2023; business use increases 3 cents per mile

WASHINGTON — The Internal Revenue Service today issued the 2023 optional standard mileage rates used to calculate the deductible costs of operating an automobile for business, charitable, medical or moving purposes.

Beginning on Jan. 1, 2023, the standard mileage rates for the use of a car (also vans, pickups or panel trucks) will be:

- 5 cents per mile driven for business use, up 3 cents from the
- midyear increase setting the rate for the second half of 2022. • 22 cents per mile driven for medical or moving purposes for
- qualified active-duty members of the Armed Forces, consistent with the increased midyear rate set for the second half of 2022.
- 14 cents per mile driven in service of charitable organizations; the rate is set by statute and remains unchanged from 2022.

In the 2024 Membership Year the Amount of Dues that is due to The Department of Georgia will be **\$34.00** for **Senior Membership**. The rate of **\$5.00** for **Junior Membership**. This will cover the cost for the National Dues as well as the Department of Georgia Dues. <u>PLEASE NOTE THE INCREASE THAT IS DUE TO DEPARTMENT!!</u> We are now accepting all Dues rate changes for the amount that will be listed on your Dues Renewal notices that are sent from National to your members letting them know it is now time to pay your 2024 Membership dues and what amount they should be paying. <u>THIS FORM IS MANDATORY TO RETURN BY THE DUE DATE!!!!</u> If your Unit intends to make any changes to the current rates they are currently charging we need to be receiving those now, so that the changes can be made in our system and

Units will not experience wrong information being sent to their members. It is very important that your Unit evaluates the amounts they are currently charging and make the necessary adjustments ASAP. This form needs to be returned to the Department

NO later than May 1st, 2023 so that all changes can be processed. If this form is not received your Unit Dues may be listed incorrectly on the notices sent to your Members for their Renewals. All incorrect amounts that may be listed due to not receiving this form will be the fault of the Unit, not the Department or National. <u>The amount of \$34</u> per Senior & \$5.00 per Junior will still be due to the Department, regardless of what amount is listed on the renewal Notice.
