HISTORY MATTERS

All History reports from Units and Districts are due to me by May 1, 2024. If sent by USPS, the reports must be postmarked on or before May 1, 2024.

Whether your Unit has a Historian or not, I am respectfully requesting information from each Unit, so I can include something about your unit in our Department History book. I do **not** need a written explanation of each statistic, rather I just need your numbers. As an example, your Unit might have placed fifty-two wreaths on veterans' graves at Christmas, your Unit might have instructed eighty-two children on how to fold a flag, or your members visited twenty-six veterans during Veteran's Day. I know Units in Georgia have been terribly busy this year, I have heard about your events, and seen some on our Facebook pages. So please, give me what you have! Handwritten, typed, texted, emailed, or called in - what is important is I receive something from every Unit so I can mention all the remarkable things you have accomplished this year when I write the Department History book. As most of you are aware, the next time we meet in person will be at our Department Convention in June.

Thanks for all the work you have done in the past to support Georgia Girls State! If you are not the person in your area working on Girls State, please forward this email to whomever is, if you are able to do so.

The Board of Directors hopes that Girls State 2024 will be the best ever. We are looking forward to a very successful session. We can only have that with your continued help and support.

Georgia Girls State will be held in Valdosta, Georgia at Valdosta State University

June 9-14, 2024

QUALIFICATIONS: Interest in government, leadership, citizenship, honesty, scholarship, character, and completion of their junior year in high school.

ORIENTATION: Orientation should be a part of your Girls State plan so that the girls and their parents understand in advance what to expect upon arrival. Please call on a staff member or former citizen in your area to help with your orientation if help is needed.

PUBILICITY: Unit chairpersons, be sure to contact local media for coverage as soon as your delegates have been selected. Many newspapers are willing to publish pictures and short articles about the program. Invite delegates to a unit meeting after the session to report to the unit.

****FEE:** Checks must be made out to Girls State and mailed to the Department Headquarters. **Send the fee of \$350.00** per girl to the American Legion Auxiliary Department Headquarters, 3035 Mt. Zion Road, Stockbridge, GA 30281 <u>before April 20, 2024</u> to assure space for your girls. **Call the director for late payments of fees**. Let me know if you have girls to send and lack fees. We have donations from units which do not have girls to sponsor, and they want to have girls chosen from other areas. This year it is imperative that we know how many to expect for the session. I have supplies to order and we must reprint the manual. Please DO NOT hold your unit check to make sure your girls are attending. Any money that is sent in helps Georgia Girls State even if your girls doesn't attend. If your girl backs out at the last minute, there are other worthy girls that the money can cover. It can also be a donation to the program to help cover other costs. We have expenses to pay before the session begins, so please do not hold the fees.

DISTRICTS: Each district is to elect a counselor and pay \$350.00 counselor fee. Please notify the director upon the election and have the counselor send the director a resume. Even if your district doesn't elect a counselor, the fee is still to be paid. It's not too late to recommend a counselor.

APPLICATIONS: The 2024 online application will be initiated by using the pre-application. It can be found on the website. Follow the instructions on the top of the document. The tech staff will input the information into the online application the unit contract will receive updates

IMPACT REPORTS

It is time to get the reporting done. It starts with YOU - the MEMBERS!

Why and How? https://www.legion-aux.org/Member/Impact-Report

Do not let anyone tell you it does not matter or is not expected – reports are expected from each unit and district! This is particularly important to our department and to ALA nationally. It is our chance to capture the impact of what:

I (a member) Our unit Our District and Our Department **did in the past 12 months since May 1* last year.**

Members submit their impact reports to the Unit President or her/his designee. This is for service from May 1st of last year *OR* the last time they reported through April 30th of this year. Check with your Unit President for the deadline to turn in reports to the Unit President.

Unit Presidents then compile this data and submit the UNIT Impact Report to District Presidents no later than May 1.

District Presidents submit their DISTRICT IMPACT REPORTS to the Department Secretary no later than MAY 15 so that the Department can submit its complete IMPACT REPORT **ON TIME** to National .

Let us get to 100% this year – help your District President so that EVERY HOUR, DOLLAR, and MILE is reported.

NOTE about mileage and time. Travel time counts: if you are going to an event/activity, record the travel time and the mileage (in dollars). It is YOUR TIME – <u>your time has value</u> – traveling to/from and DOING is YOUR TIME. However, do not double dip on the mileage – for example, do not record money you spent on gas, only record the equivalent amount of dollars for the miles you drove. Example, if you drove 10 miles, you report \$1.40 and the amount of time to drive to/from the event/activity AND the time serving at the event/activity.
