The call for the first National Convention of the women Auxiliary was issued by John G. Emery, National Commander of the American Legion, when the convention met

in Kansas City, Missouri, November 1-2, 1921. Representatives were present from practically every state in the Union, and from two foreign possessions.


A National Constitution and Bylaws patterned after those adopted by the American Legion were approved. The original name of the organization was "Women's Auxiliary of the American Legion" and was changed to American

Legion Auxiliary" after the adoption of Section 1, Article XIII of The American Legion 's constitution. The Auxiliary was incorporated under the laws of the state of Indiana on the 11th day of November, 1932.

The history of the Auxiliary's Birthday- It was moved by Mrs. Robert Lincoln Hoyal and seconded by Mrs. W. Graydon Painter that the American Legion Auxiliary designate as its birth date, November 10, 1919, the date that The American Legion authorized the formation of this organization. Mrs. Mark W. Murrill moved, that the words and that such date be established after consultation with the American Legion which brought us into being, being added. The motion as amended was carried, (Res. Com. Rep., National Convention 1954, Washington, DC.

The American Legion was chartered by Congress in 1919 as a patriotic veteran's organization. Focusing on service to veterans, service members and communities. The American Legion committee determined that the best way to build an effective auxiliary was to build from ground up creating a new patriotic women's organization to work with the Legion. In fulfillment of our Mission, the American Legion Auxiliary, to support and advocate for veterans, active military and their families.

ALA MIS PROGRAM ACCESS for Units/District Membership <u>Monies are DUE into Dept when Access is</u> <u>Requested.</u>

The fee is \$10 per year per person (2 per Unit). This is the fee National charges. Forms are on the website or call the Department for copies. Due to the enforced rules all forms must be completed and signed by 5 current Unit Officer. At no time is an authorized person using ALA MIS is to share their password with anyone. If a person needs to be changed please send in a new form right away. Please let us know ASAP. If Unit wants to continue having access to the ALA MIS the department must receive new forms and \$10 for each person per calendar year.

New: District Presidents can now have access to all the Units in their districts. This will be a read only and cannot make any changes. The fee is \$10 and will be good until December.

Bulletin # 1

Georgia Girls State will be held in Statesboro, Georgia at Georgia Southern University June 7-12, 2020

QUALIFICATIONS: Interest in government, leadership, citizenship, honesty, scholarship, character, and completion of their junior year in high school.

ORIENTATION: Orientation should be a part of your Girls State plan so that the girls and their parents understand in advance what to expect upon arrival. Please call on a staff member or former citizen in your area to help with your orientation if help is needed.

PUBILICITY: Unit chairmen, be sure to contact local media for coverage as soon as your delegates have been selected. Many newspapers are willing to publish pictures and short articles about the program. Invite delegates to a unit meeting after the session to report to the unit.

****FEE:** Checks must be made out to Girls State and mailed to the Department Headquarters. **Send the fee of \$300.00** per girl to the American Legion Auxiliary Department Headquarters, 3035 Mt. Zion Road, Stockbridge, GA 30281 <u>before April 20, 2020</u> to assure space for your girls. Call the director for late payments of fees. Please do not hold the fees to make sure the girl plans to attend. Please DO NOT hold your unit check to make sure your girls are attending. This really hurts our program. Any money that is sent in helps Georgia Girls State even if your girls doesn't attend. If your girl backs out at the last minute, there are other worthy girls that the money can cover. It can also be a donation to the program to help cover other costs. We have expenses to pay before the session begins, so please do not hold the fees. Parents nor family members should not pay the fee for their daughter. **DISTRICTS:** Each district is to elect a counselor and pay \$300.00 counselor fee. Please notify the director upon the election and have the counselor send the director a resume. Even if your district doesn't elect a counselor, the fee is still to be paid. I need counselors: Please contact me if interested!!

APPLICATIONS: The 2020 online application will be available on the website on February 20, 2020. UNITS must open an account and enter girls' names and email addresses into the system. Also, the school name and email address of the High School counselor in charge of the student must be entered. The girls and the school counselor will then receive an email with a link to the application and a password so that they can go to the online application and complete it. The parent waiver and medical history will be done on line; the parent uses the same user name which is the girls' email address and password as the girl. Please make sure the girls use a personal email address like yahoo or gmail. The emails that are issued by the school for a student sometimes do not allow them to open a link.

OPENING AN ACCOUNT: <u>www.georgiagirlsstate.org</u> You should use a 3 digit user name which is your unit number. For single or double digit unit numbers, you must put zeros in front so that it has 3 digits. For example, Unit 6 would have a user name of 006. Please make your password simple. Do not open multiple accounts. If something goes wrong when opening your account, we can solve the problem. I will answer my phone if you call or call you back asap if you leave a message or if you send me a text. Please do not tell schools, parents, or students to open an account.

STATISTICS: Homeless women veterans in Georgia slowly, steadily rise in numbers.

Georgia Homelessness Statistics. As of January 2018, had an estimated **9,499** experiencing homelessness on any given day. Female veterans are the fastest growing segment of the homeless veteran population. While the exact number of homeless female veterans is unknown, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires an annual count of homeless people in communities across the country known as the Point-in-Time Count. On a single night in January 2014, volunteers identified <u>4,722</u> female veterans representing 10 percent of the total homeless veteran population. The number of homeless female veterans has more than tripled since 2006 when 1,380 women were counted. Despite the fact that women veterans have not been treated equal, so say that they are more likely to be underemployed than their civilian counterparts, more likely to commit suicide, and more likely to end up homeless. **Don't under estimate the POWER & STRENGTH OF WOMAN**.
